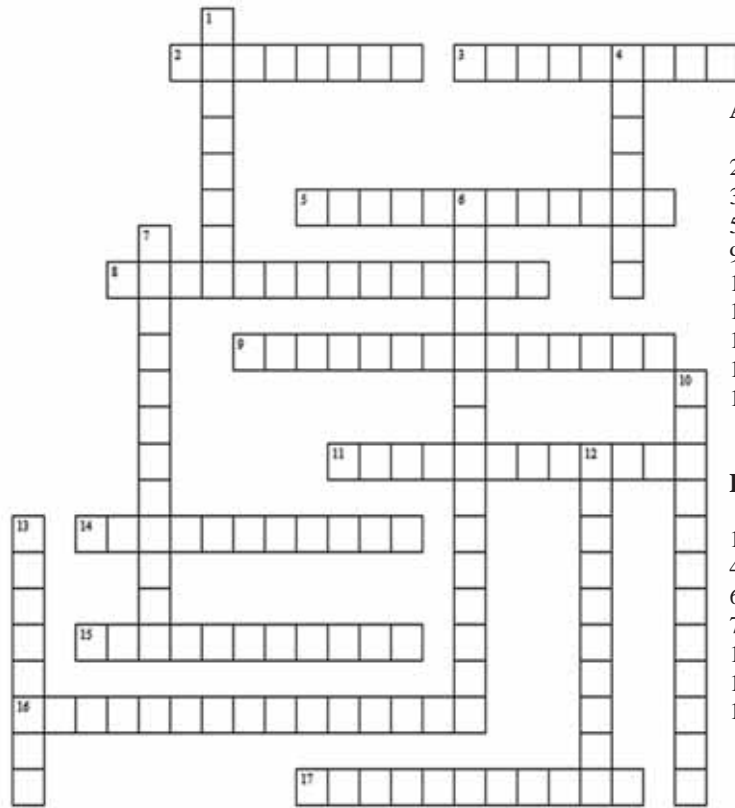

Feature Article: Blanchet Teachers Have Strong Ties to Catholic Secondary Education

Two Blanchet Catholic School teachers reflect on their Salem Catholic school education.

Mary Heckel Angove has taught French and English at Blanchet since 1997. Her son, Seth, is a Blanchet alumni who graduated in 2004. Mary is an alumna of both Sacred Heart Academy and St. Joseph School.

Deb Pavelek has taught religion and Spanish at Blanchet since 2007. She attended Sacred Heart Academy for middle school through 10th grade. Deb's family has been strong supporters of Catholic education for decades. Her father, Gerry, is a 1958 graduate of Serra Catholic High School and his parents were instrumental in Serra's establishment. Deb's brother Tom was recently honored as the 2009 Distinguished Alumni for St. Joseph School in downtown Salem. Deb also attended St. Joseph School, where her grandmother, Jean Pavelek, was her 3rd grade teacher.

Deb remembers many fun school outings as a student at Sacred Heart, including trips to the mountains to sled and a hiking adventure along the Pacific Crest Trail. She says that the school cared about the "formation of the whole person," and that there was a lot of positive school spirit.

Prior to Sacred Heart relocating to what is now Chemeketa Community College, Mary recalls that the old building in downtown Salem was wonderful for students, but was old and crowded for the sisters who lived there. She remembers that there was not much hot water and also recalls studying with a Latin teacher who had attended the school when she was a girl in the 1920's. The school was serious about its Catholic identity, and weekly liturgies were a part of the tradition. Similar to Blanchet, Sacred

Heart offered retreats for each of its classes. However, there was one important difference – retreats were “silent” and students were not allowed to talk. Speakers would offer readings which were followed by periods of silence and reflection. Mary recalls listening to speakers from Marylhurst University and visiting a Trappist monastery in Lafayette.

Deb finds many similarities between Sacred Heart and Blanchet. Sacred Heart Mid-High opened on Lancaster, and underwent similar challenges to Blanchet in its formative years. Parent support and involvement was high. Deb recalls learning about the Founders of the Holy Name Sisters each October. Sacred Heart was similar to Blanchet as it offered a mid high curriculum and worked hard to foster community among its faculty and students. Mary remembers that fundraising has always been critical to the success of Catholic schools and recalls selling candy bars as a student at Sacred Heart. “The nuns and everyone at the school were nice to us,” says Mary. Similar to Blanchet, teachers reached out to their students and took a personal interest in their development. §

:: Gerry's Corner

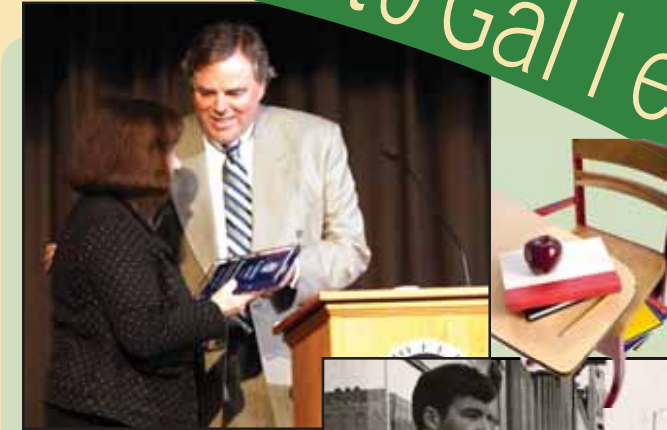
